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TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS FOR SENIOR ADULTS IN THE CAPITAL REGION



DIRECTORY

For seniors, transportation is a vital aspect of remaining independent since it provides access to healthcare, support services, and community activities. Many Americans take for granted using their own vehicles to arrive at their destination with little thought about how they are going to get there.

For many seniors, health conditions prevent them from driving safely to appointments. Medical appointments, grocery shopping, and social activities can decrease after people no longer have the ability to drive themselves or have a friend or family member to transport them to their appointments. Arranging transportation to appointments can be a burdensome and sometimes impossible task without having current information on transportation options.

Yet, there are many options in addition to a personal vehicle for senior transportation. Public transportation, senior transportation vans, medical transportation services, volunteer-based transportation services, and taxis provide transportation services. More recent transportation options for seniors include Uber, Lyft, and GoGoGrandparent.

Often transportation options for seniors is highly dependent on where the senior lives (urban, suburban, or rural settings), including the county or municipality of residence; the ability to pay for the transportation services; and what type of adaptive equipment the rider needs (including a wheelchair or walker) to ambulate.

This directory provides the name, contact information, specific services provided, hours of service, accommodations, and fees for the senior transportation options in Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga, and Schenectady counties.

Developed by Albany Guardian Society, the Capital District Transportation Committee and the Siena College NExT program, this directory is intended to assist seniors in finding the best and most affordable transportation options for their healthcare, support, and service appointments.

The Capital District Transportation Committee (CDTC)

is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization required by federal law for the Albany-Schenectady-Troy and Saratoga Springs metropolitan areas. Supported with federal funding, CDTC is a forum for local elected officials and transportation representatives to share ideas and make decisions about major transportation capital investments, including about \$100 million in mostly federal funding per year. The Regional Transportation Coordination Committee (RTCC) is hosted by CDTC and includes public, private, non-profit, and human services transportation providers. The RTCC works toward better integration and coordination of public transit-human service agency transportation services.

How to Use this Directory

How Is the Directory Organized?

The directory is organized alphabetically by organization name. At the beginning of the directory, we have included a table showing which organizations provide services in each county – Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga, and Schenectady.

Am I Eligible?

Many of the organizations listed here restrict their services to certain individuals. Restrictions may be based on your age, where you live and whether you have a disability or other health condition. In addition, some organizations require you to pre-register before receiving a ride or other services. These restrictions are listed in the “Who May Ride” section within each listing.

Where Can I Go?

Most organizations listed here will provide services within a certain area. This area is frequently defined by town or city. Some organizations will only provide a ride for certain trip purposes, such as medical or shopping. This information is listed in the “Description” section within each listing.

What If I Have a Disability, or Need Special Accommodations?

This directory notes the ability to provide services if you use a wheelchair, a service animal, have limited or no vision, or if you have dementia. These are all contained in the “Can Accommodate” section within each listing. If a listing does not have a “Can Accommodate” section, the organization may not have an ability to provide services to you. If you have any questions about available accommodations, you may contact the organization directly.

If you use a walker, cane, or other mobility aids, you will need to be able to enter and exit the vehicle without assistance, and load it into the vehicle yourself. If you use a large mobility aid and you are scheduling a ride in a small vehicle such as a van, you may want to advise the provider that you will need some space for your mobility aid.

Where Can I Get More Information?

Each listing provides contact information that you can use to contact each organization directly and request additional information.

What Do Transportation Providers Expect of Me?

All providers require riders to remain seated with a seatbelt, or in the case of a wheelchair, that it is secured, for the duration of the trip.

What About Taxis?

There are many different taxi companies in the Capital Region, some with only one vehicle, others with several vehicles. For the sake of simplicity, only taxi companies that have at least one wheelchair accessible vehicle are listed in this directory.

What is Uber and Lyft?

They are both private transportation services that employ individually contracted drivers to provide the transportation. Rides are arranged electronically (primarily through a smartphone) for one-way transportation.

What is GoGoGrandparent?

It’s a service accessed through the telephone that arranges transportation for seniors, using Uber or Lyft. There is a separate charge for this service beyond the cost of the transportation. A family member or friend can be registered to receive text messages about the trip in case they are concerned about the person who requested the ride. They will receive text messages when the person requested a ride, who the name of the driver is, how long before the driver gets there, if they got picked up, and when they were driven back home.

To Schedule: Schedule ahead as much as possible but 24 hours is required.

Who May Ride: Albany County residents 60+ who do not own a car or have other means of transportation and are not Medicaid recipients; Medicaid recipients can go for shopping once a week.

Description: Provides local rides to adult day programs, doctor, pharmacy, congregate meals, and groceries. Also provides trips to medical appointments in Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga, and Schenectady Counties. First time callers will need to be registered by a call center representative and sign a consent form.
Service hours: anytime.

Can Accommodate: Service dogs, wheelchairs.

To Schedule: Call Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m., at least 2 business days ahead unless it is an emergency.

Fees: Suggested contribution of half the cost of trip by cash or check.

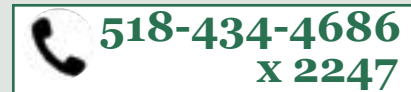

Who May Ride: People living with HIV/AIDS who are not eligible for Medicaid transportation. In areas that have buses, a doctor note explaining the medical reason you can't use the bus is required to be eligible for a taxi.

Description: The program provides taxi rides, bus passes, and bus or train tickets to medical and other services that help you maintain your health.

Description: Curb-to-curb volunteer service to cancer-related medical appointments. No restrictions on area or distance, although all rides are subject to volunteer availability. Drivers can't provide assistance, but patients may bring a caregiver to assist them. Foldable wheelchairs and walkers are acceptable, if patient folds themselves.

Service hours: anytime, but rides are subject to volunteer availability.

Can Accommodate: Service animals, people with limited or no vision.

To Schedule: Call at least 3 business days and up to 2 months ahead. Advise if bringing caregiver or service animal.

Fees: No fee.

Who May Ride: Town of Bethlehem residents who are 60 or older and live in their own homes or apartments and not in assisted living or nursing facilities.

Description: Curb-to-curb transportation, within 17 miles of Town Hall, in Town vehicles (cars/small buses) driven by trained volunteers supervised by Bethlehem Senior Services staff. Medical appointments and therapy are the priority with planned grocery shopping and hairdresser/barber appointments on specific days. Social and recreational trips are planned. Bank, pharmacy & voting are possible.

Service hours: 8:30 a.m. – 3 p.m. Please do not make appointments beginning later than 2 p.m.

Can Accommodate: Wheelchairs.

To Schedule: Rides are pre-arranged. Call Monday – Friday, 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. Appointments should be scheduled as far in advance as possible.

Fees: No fee. Suggested donations are posted in vehicles.

Description: Subsidiary of Advantage Transit Group. Provides transportation for people in a wheelchair or stretcher, including Medicaid trips. Rides are generally but not guaranteed to be exclusive. Aide or escort may ride free.

Service hours: 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Can Accommodate: Wheelchairs, stretchers, service animals, people with limited or no vision, people with dementia.

To Schedule: Calling at least 1 day ahead is preferable, but same day trips may be possible.

Fees: Call for fees. All pricing is by mileage. Outer Saratoga County may be cost-prohibitive. Payment is by cash, check, or if over the phone by credit card.

Description: Volunteer drivers provide rides including for medical appointments and shopping. Call to discuss any assistance you may require.

Can Accommodate: Walkers.

Who May Ride: Schenectady County residents age 60+. Medical transportation is limited to those not receiving Medicaid.

Description: Transportation provides door-to-door service to medical appointments primarily in Schenectady County. Trips originating in Schenectady County to destinations outside of the county may be available on a limited basis. Anyone wishing to access medical transportation must call the program in advance to complete the registration process.

Transportation is provided to and from congregate dining sites as well as to grocery shopping trips and special outings from the Agency's congregate dining site. Reservations are required and are arranged through the congregate dining sites.

Service hours: Monday – Friday, 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Can Accommodate: Wheelchairs, service animals, people with limited or no vision, people with dementia.

To Schedule: Call in advance. Advise if you need escort service.

Fees: There is no required fee for service. Suggested donation of \$4 for medical transport, \$6 for wheelchair/assistance, dining \$1.25 each way. An additional \$1 for shopping trips.

Description: Fixed route transit along established bus routes in and around Albany, Saratoga Springs, Schenectady, Troy, and Rensselaer. Drivers will assist wheelchair users to secure the wheelchair once in vehicle.

Who May Ride: People who because of a disability or impairment are unable to use the regular fixed route buses. Precertification is required and can take 21 business days.

Description: Complementary paratransit within 3/4 mile of a fixed CDTA route. Reasonable assistance is provided on and off the vehicle and to the building entrance. Companions may ride as space allows and with advance notice.

Service Hours: 6 a.m. - 1 a.m.

Can Accommodate: Wheelchairs, service animals, people with limited or no vision.

To Schedule: Call or email before 4 p.m. the day before the trip is needed, up to 7 days in advance.

Fees: \$2.50 by cash, exact amount only; or STAR tickets.

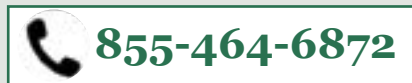

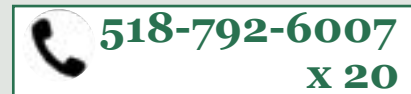

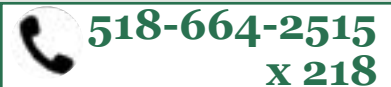
